Prix Versailles awarded Six Senses Fort Barwara in Rajasthan (above right) with a 2022 World Architecture and Design Award for the Hotels category. Melbourne-based designers Mitchell & Eades were behind the decade-long transformation of the 14th-century fort into a luxury hotel that enhances the building's architectural legacy.
